## PUBLIC HOLIDAY ACT

## ARRANGEMENT OF SECTIONS

## Section

1. Short title
2. Public holidays
3. Acts to be done on public holiday
4. Public holidays falling on Sundays
5. Power to declare additional public holidays

1. This Act may be cited as the Public Holidays Act.

Short title.

2. The several days specified in the Schedule to this Act (hereinafter referred to as "public holidays") shall be kept, except as hereinafter provided, as close holidays in all court of law, in all Government offices and in all banks in Seychelles and shall be legal holidays for all persons throughout Seychelles.

Public holidays.

3. Any act required to be done by or before a Judge or officer of any court or by or before any Government official upon any day which is a public holiday may be lawfully done upon the day not being itself a public holiday, next following such first mentioned public holiday.

4. Where any public holiday, except Sunday, falls on a Sunday the next following day, not being itself a public holiday, shall be a public holiday.

5. The President may by Order published in the *Gazette* from time to time proclaim that any day or days shall be observed in Seychelles as public holidays in addition to the days mentioned in the Schedule, and any day set apart by virtue of such order as a public holiday shall be so observed throughout Seychelles in the

same manner and to the same extent as the days specified in the Schedule hereto.

All Saints Day (1st November)

The Feast of the Immaculate Conception (8th December)

Christmas Day (25th December)

Note: This Act has, since 31st December 1991, been amended by Act 5 of 1994 to include National Day, 18th June, as a public holiday.
