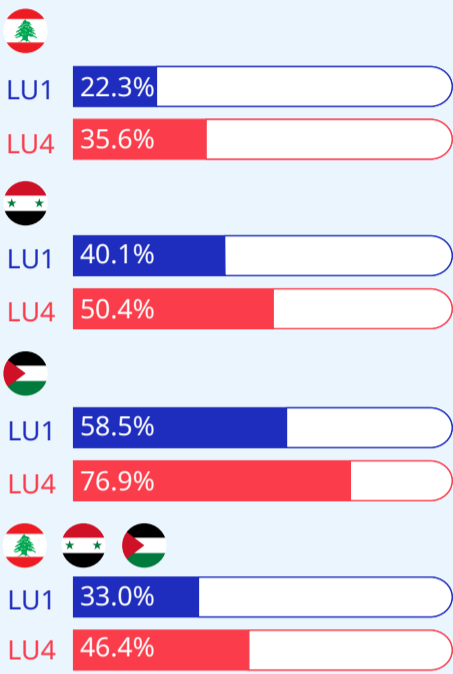

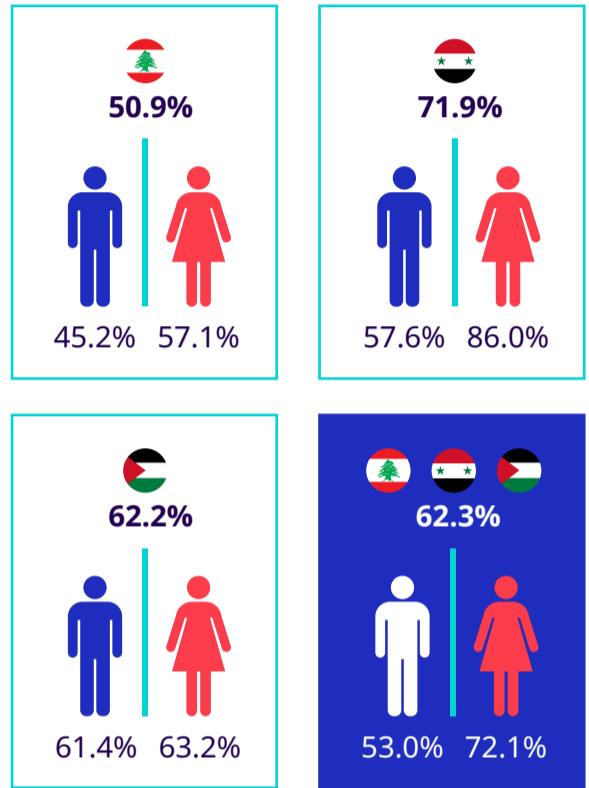

Labour underutilization, in %

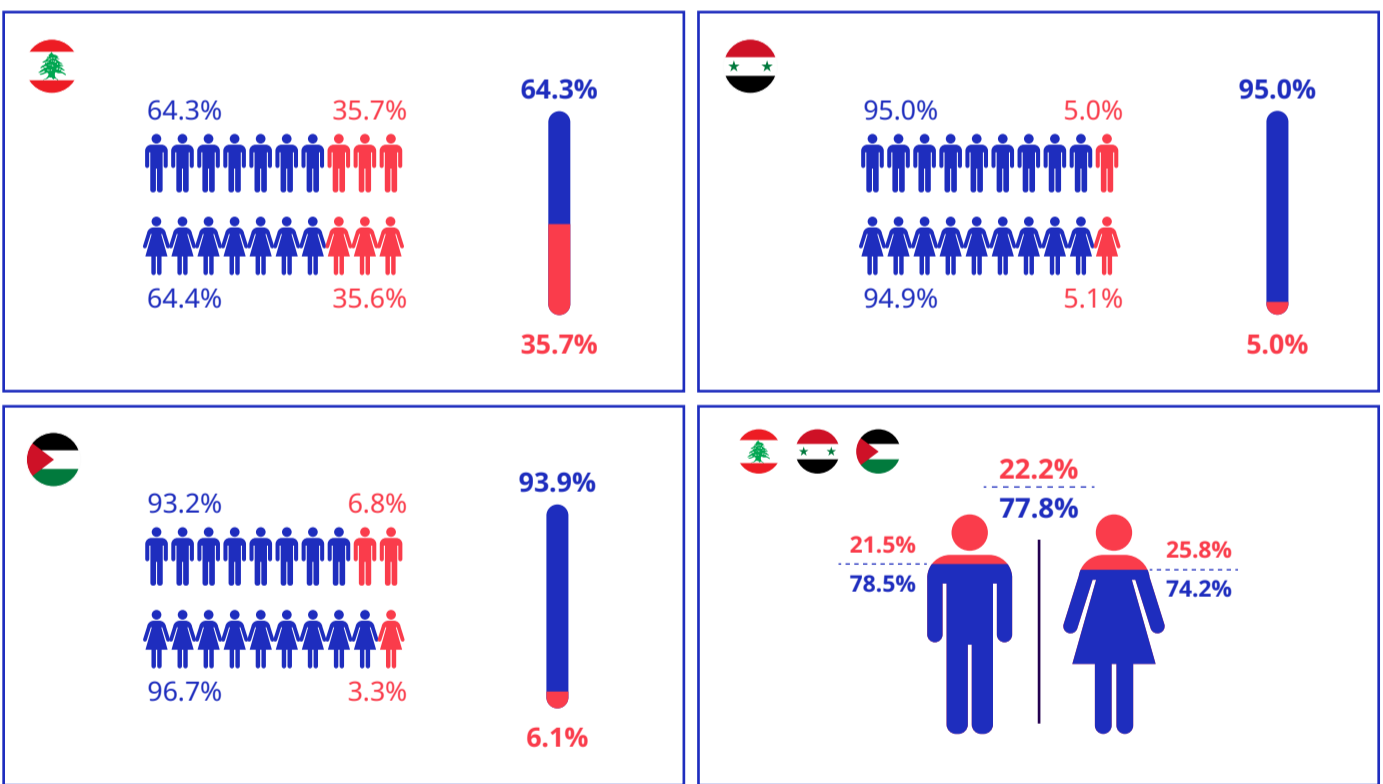


LU1: Unemployment rate

Youth NEET rates by sex and nationality, in %

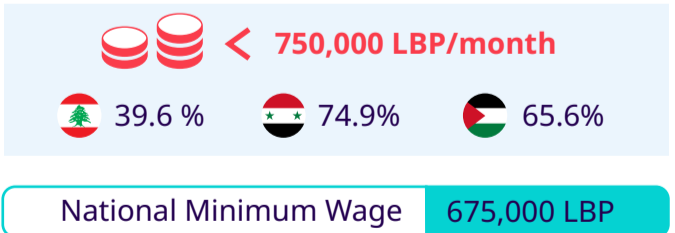


Formal and informal employment by sex and nationality, in %
