

Apparel Supply Chain Structure





Analysis of drivers and constraints for OSH in GSC



- Who are the players of the supply chain and what are their respective levels of influence on OSH improvement in the chain?
- What is the significance of relations and inter-relations between these players?
- What are the main influences at play that impact OSH outcomes at each level of the chain
- What are the OSH deficits or good practices in the chain?



Barriers and entry points in the garment supply chain

Drivers

- National legal frameworks on OSH
- Buyers' requirements on OSH
- Availability of OSH services
- Employers' and workers' organizations
- OSH committees

Constraints

- Limited enforcement capacity
- Limited technical ressources on OSH
- Lack of coordination between institutions providing services
- Lack of data on OSH
- Absence of OSH-MS



Overcoming constraints and promoting drivers to improve OSH in the garment supply chain: the need for a coordinated and systematic approach

A systematic approach to OSH, at national and enterprise level, that considers

- A careful assessment of the needs and adaptation of the OSH-MS accordingly;
- System focused on performance of OSH measures and continuous improvement;
- Audits contributing to the continual improvement process;
- A review of regulatory requirements and regular updating;
- Training carried out on a continuous basis at all levels;
- Communication channels to improve coordination and effectiveness;
- Effective social dialogue;
- Responsibilities of stakeholders are defined;
- Labour inspectors are adequately trained to enforce and support compliance.
