

The Skills Challenge Innovation Call invites individuals and organizations to propose new and practical ideas and solutions to key skills challenges that have the potential for scaling-up and replication on a wider scale.



The Skills Innovation Lab is a six-month programme through which the winning proposal from the Challenge Call receives technical support and guidance from ILO Skills Specialists and partner innovation experts to develop their ideas into prototypes ready for implementation.



Skills Innovation Connections is a global network of skills innovators that connects innovators, ILO constituents, Technical and Vocational Education and Training (TVET) Institutions, academia and development practitioners to share ideas, experiences and collaborate to develop and scale innovations for identified skills challenges.
