	According to the Government	2017 AR: According to the Government: the main challenges are: a) lack of awareness – the youth are deceived into difficult situations because of lack of complete understanding and knowledge of forced labour; b) Social and economic circumstances – unemployment rate is high due to economic crisis; and c) Challenges linked to migration policies: -some people are unemployed because of migration from rural areas to capital city.
TECHNICAL COOPERATION NEEDS	Request	2017 AR: The Government indicated the need for technical cooperation with the ILO in the following areas: i) <i>More importantly:</i> a) Collection and analysis of data and information; a) Promotion of fair recruitment and placement practices; c) Promotion of fair migration policies; d) Awareness-raising and mobilization activities; e) Capacity building for the competent authorities; f) Capacity building for employers' and workers' organizations; g) Strengthening the legal framework; h) Exchange of experiences between countries or regions; international cooperation; i) Assessment, in cooperation with the ILO, of the obstacles identified and their impact on the realization of the principle; j) Guidance on the development of the national policy and plan of action; k) Vocational training, job-creation and income-generation programmes for at-risk populations; and l) inter-institutional coordination; ii) <i>Less importantly:</i> a) Promotion of freedom of association and collective bargaining to enable at-risk workers to join workers' organizations; b) Basic social security guarantees; and c) Guidance on supporting due diligence.
