FIRST ITEM ON THE AGENDA

Programme and Budget for 2008–09: Regular budget account and Working Capital Fund

1. Information on the position of 2008–09 income and expenditure as at 30 September 2009 is submitted herewith. Additional information on the position of member States in relation to the receipt of contributions and additional 2008–09 expenditure items approved by the Governing Body is provided in tables in Appendix I. Tables 1 and 2 summarize and give details of member States' contributions for 2009, the amounts received and credited for current contributions and arrears of contributions up to 30 September 2009, and the amounts due as at that date, while table 3 gives details of additional 2008–09 expenditure items approved by the Governing Body.

Budgetary income and expenditure

2. Budgetary income is accounted for in US dollars at the ILO budget rate of exchange for the 2008–09 financial period, and Swiss franc expenditure is recorded in US dollars at the same rate of exchange, namely 1.23 Swiss francs (CHF) to the US dollar. Assessed contributions received and expenditure recorded during the current biennium up to 30 September 2009 were as follows:

Contributions of member States

- **3.** Total assessed contributions for 2009 amount to CHF394,674,206 ¹ compared with CHF394,669,749 ² for 2008. Section I of table 1 indicates that, at 30 September 2009, assessed contributions for 2009 received from or credited to member States ³ totalled CHF266,671,519, which represented 67.6 per cent of the contributions assessed. For the same period in 2008, 63.2 per cent of the 2008 contributions had been collected. At 30 September 2009, 105 member States had settled their 2009 contributions in full, 26 member States had made partial payments while 51 others had made no payments against 2009 contributions. This compared with 96, 32 and 53 member States in the same situation respectively as at the same date in 2008.
- **4.** Contributions received in 2009 in respect of 2008 and prior financial periods totalled CHF43,154,918, bringing total contributions collected as at 30 September 2009 to CHF309,826,437.
- 5. At 30 September, 44 member States had made payments against their 2010 contributions. These were Albania, Angola, Bahamas, Benin, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Bulgaria, Burkina Faso, Chile, Congo, Czech Republic, Egypt, Equatorial Guinea, Gabon, Guinea, Guyana, Honduras, India, Jamaica, Kazakhstan, Kuwait, Latvia, Madagascar, Malawi, Malaysia, Mozambique, Myanmar, Namibia, Nepal, Nicaragua, Nigeria, Oman, Paraguay, Portugal, Saint Kitts and Nevis, Saint Lucia, Solomon Islands, Sri Lanka, Suriname, Swaziland, United Republic of Tanzania, Togo, Uganda, Viet Nam and Zimbabwe.

Position in relation to paragraph 4 of article 13 of the Constitution

- **6.** Table 2 shows that, on 30 September 2009, the arrears of contributions of 14 member States equalled or exceeded the amount of the contributions due from them for the past two full years (2007–08). These were Antigua and Barbuda, Cape Verde, Comoros, Djibouti, Dominica, Gambia, Guinea-Bissau, Kyrgyzstan, Sao Tome and Principe, Sierra Leone, Somalia, Tajikistan, Turkmenistan and Uzbekistan. In accordance with the provisions of paragraph 4 of article 13 of the Constitution of the Organization each of these member States had therefore lost the right to vote.
- 7. A further 14 member States have arrears of contributions in excess of the amount due from them for the past two full years but are permitted to vote in accordance with paragraph 4 of article 13 of the Constitution of the Organization under financial arrangements approved by the International Labour Conference, at the following Sessions: 93rd (2005) for Armenia, 95th (2006) for Azerbaijan, 86th (1998) for Belarus, 82nd (1995) for Cambodia, 97th (2008) for Central African Republic, 93rd (2005) for Georgia, 97th

Working Capital Fund

8. The nominal level and the cash level of the Working Capital Fund as at 30 September 2009 both stood at CHF35 million.

Possible transfers within the 2008–09 expenditure budget

- **9.** Article 16 of the Financial Regulations provides that transfers from one item to another in the same part of the expenditure budget may be effected by special resolutions of the Governing Body.
- 10. At this stage it is not possible to estimate accurately and in detail the final level of expenditure under each budget item; it is possible, however, that for some items, expenditure may exceed the budgetary provision, offset by savings under other budget items. The specific items between which transfers might need to be made and the exact amounts will be known only when final expenditure figures are available at the end of January 2010. Following the usual practice, the Director-General therefore proposes to submit a detailed list of any necessary transfers to the Chairperson of the Governing Body for approval at that time.
- 11. The Committee may wish to recommend that the Governing Body delegate its authority under article 16 of the Financial Regulations by requesting the Director-General to submit proposals for any necessary transfers within the 2008–09 expenditure budget to the Chairperson for approval, prior to the closing of the biennial accounts, subject to confirmation of such approval by the Governing Body at its 307th Session (March 2010).
