I. Introduction

- 1. In a *note verbale* dated 29 February 2012, a copy of which is contained in the appendix to this document, the Government of the Kingdom of Bhutan expresses its wish to send an observer delegation, to be led by the Minister for Labour and Human Resources, to the 101st Session of the International Labour Conference (Geneva, 30 May–15 June 2012). The Kingdom of Bhutan is a member State of the United Nations, but not of the International Labour Organization.
- 2. In the light of earlier decisions taken by the Officers of the Governing Body on its behalf authorizing the Director-General to issue invitations to the Government of the Kingdom of Bhutan to attend the 98th (2009), 99th (2010) and 100th (2011) Sessions of the International Labour Conference, the Governing Body may wish to authorize the Director-General to issue an invitation to the Government to send an observer delegation to the 101st Session of the Conference.
