## Changes in development cooperation

### ILO Development Cooperation Strategy 2020-25

- The ILC's 2018 resolution on effective development cooperation established the road map for the ILO Development Cooperation Strategy for 2020-25 and its Implementation Plan. [The Strategy](#) details how the ILO will promote better services, partnerships, resources and results for sustainable impact on people's lives.

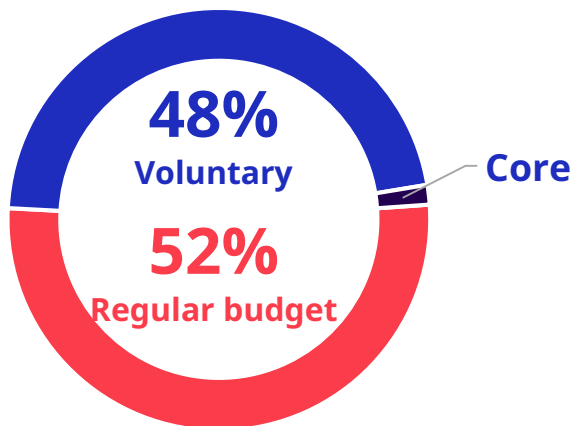
### Structured funding dialogues

- Bring together multiple funding partners in support of one Global Programme and/or P&B Policy Outcome, mutually benefitting partners and the ILO by increasing impact and reducing transaction costs.
- ILO's first [structured funding dialogue on Social Protection](#) took place in October 2021.

### Increasing demand for large integrated programmes

- Funding partners increasingly express interest in working with the ILO on themes that link to multiple POs and soft earmarking. Examples: [Humanitarian-Development-Peace nexus](#), [Leave no one behind](#), Just transition

## Budget for ILO's work



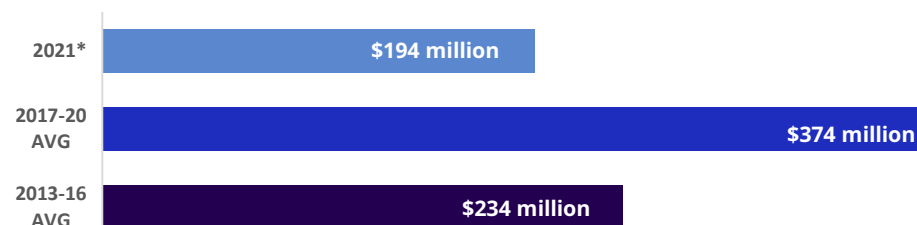

## Top 20 contributors to the ILO's voluntary funding (2020-2021\*)



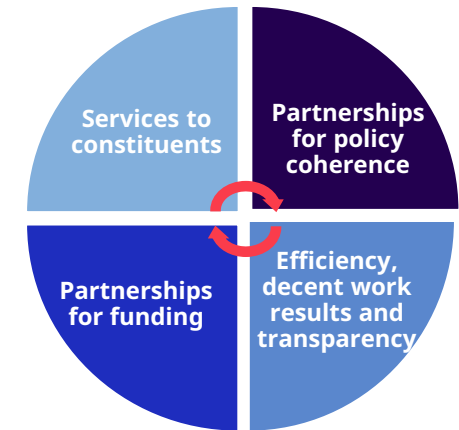

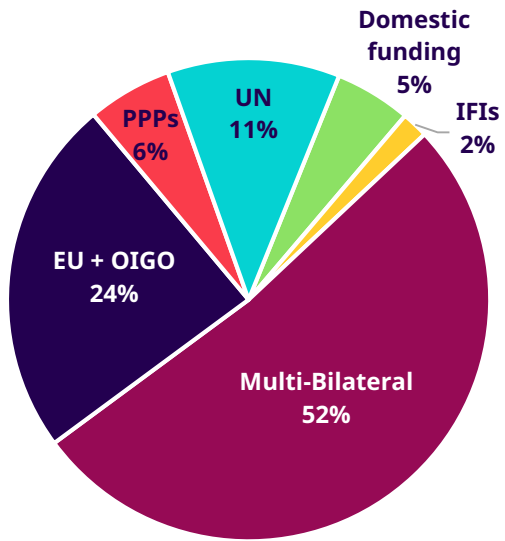


## Resource mobilisation highlights

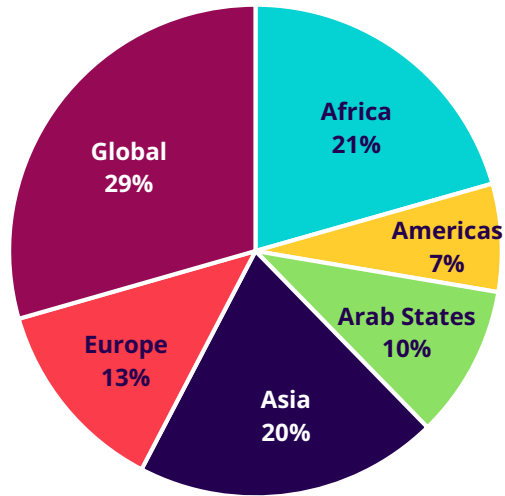
### The ILO and:

- The European Union:** supports social protection, labour migration, skills, job creation, local development and Better Work projects and programmes worldwide, with over **US\$33M** to eliminate child labour in Turkey.
- The United Nations:** Examples include 29 projects responding to the COVID-19 pandemic and the ILO programme '[Safe and Fair](#)' (Spotlight Initiative with UNWOMEN).
- The United States:** In addition to a long standing focus on combatting child labour, contributions also support the Better Work programme and aim to facilitate decent work opportunities, particularly for women and refugees
- Germany:** A US\$ 17.2M contribution from BMZ to launch a programme to [protect garment workers affected by COVID-19](#) with income support and occupational safety and health awareness campaigns and packages in seven countries and US\$ 10.9M for [agribusiness development in Ethiopia and Morocco](#).

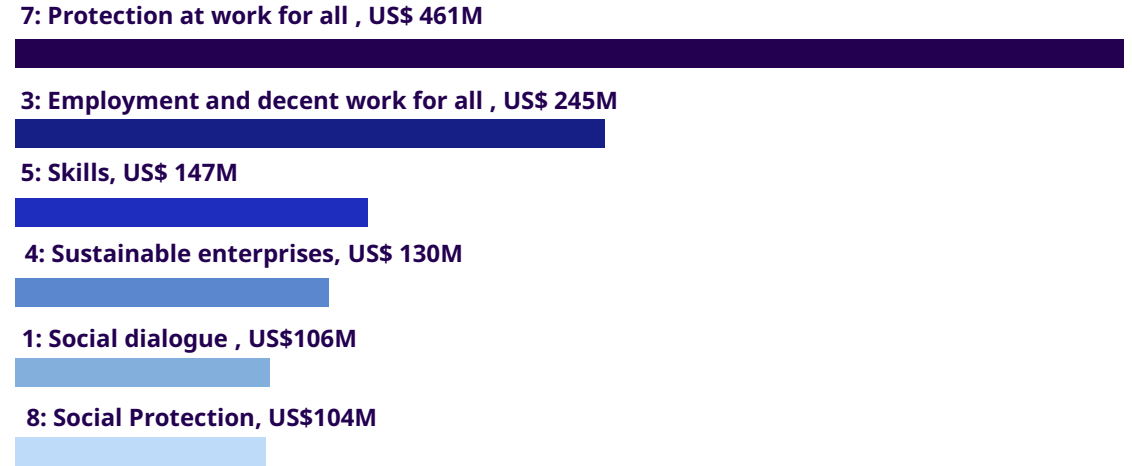
Approvals by funding source, 2020-21\*



Approvals by region, 2020-21\*

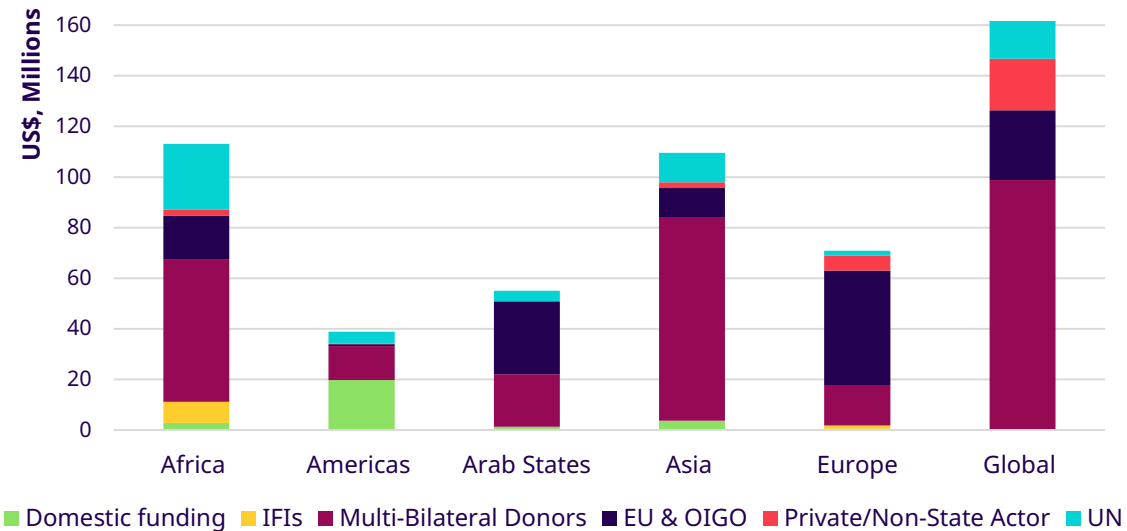


Top policy outcomes for on-going projects by total budget (out of 9)



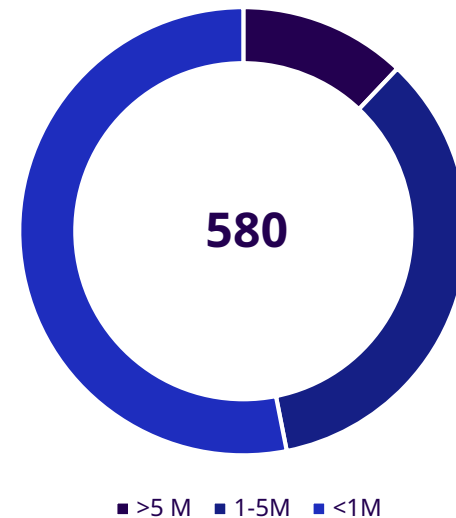
